Their father Ole Thorsen had an older brother, Nils Thorsen, who also came up here from Sogn, West-Norway. He lived some year at Dragland farm, but built a farm in Lavangen (close to where I live), and had 7 children. In 1875 he sold the farm and emigrated with whole family. They came to Webster in Minnesota (south of Minneapolis) and settled there. In 1877 died their oldest son and in 1881 died Nils Thorsen. Rest of the family left Webster and came to Aneta in North Dakota (close to Grand Forks), and here they settled and build up family. One of their sons started using Lavanger as familyname, the rest used Nelson. Maybe some of you have heard talking about those familyname. I now believe that it was this family Mikal, Daniel and Nicoline had been in contact with before they emigrated. Daniel settled in Sharon, Mikal in Grand Forks, both close to Aneta.

The new generation now have taken over Draglandfarm in Norway. Kristians
